WAKATIPU HIGH SCHOOL'S MISSION IS TO DELIVER A GREAT ALL-ROUND EDUCATION. OUR MOTTO IS "REACH FOR YOUR HEIGHTS" AND IT'S WHAT WE STRIVE TO DO EACH AND EVERY DAY.

The key priority in this great all-round education is student engagement, learning, progress and achievement. Our academic results are testament to the high levels of achievement of our students and our recent Education Review Office (ERO) report states that our "rich and varied curriculum provides many opportunities for students to learn, be challenged, explore their local environment and develop competencies for lifelong learning".

Wakatipu High School students also achieve success in vocational pathways through our Careers, Trades Academy and Gateway programmes. In addition, we provide learning support in literacy and numeracy as well as a Gifted and Talented programme to support all of our students to reach their potential. Our timetable allows junior students greater opportunity for choice and engagement while experiencing the breadth of the curriculum. ERO's has noted that we have "continued to extend the breadth and depth of our curriculum to better provide meaningful learning pathways for an increasing number of students to achieve success". As well as our academic foundation, Wakatipu High School offers students a wealth of 'all-round' extra and co-curricular opportunities in sport, arts, music, culture, community and leadership.

Geographically the Wakatipu Basin is a unique environment, enabling us to offer outstanding Outdoor Education programmes including the iconic Branches Camp. Our environment also attracts international students from around the globe, giving our students the chance to learn and grow as members of a multicultural community - an opportunity normally reserved for larger urban centres. Students' wellbeing and engagement is very important to us and the very high results of our 'student voice' surveys show that our students feel safe and enjoy coming to Wakatipu High School. ERO's report included that "a positive tone, respectful relationships and interactions are strongly evident" and that "together with clear expectations they promote high levels of engagement, learning and wellbeing across the school".

Results Driven

OUR ACADEMIC RESULTS ARE TESTAMENT TO THE HIGH LEVELS OF MOTIVATION, ACHIEVEMENT AND SUCCESS OF OUR STUDENTS.

A particular focus has been students achieving National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) Level 2. We have embraced this educational challenge and have worked to support as many of our students as possible to achieve this important qualification. Last year 92% of our Year 12 students achieved NCEA Level 2.

Higher education is also a main focus for our students. More than two thirds of our Year 13

students go on to tertiary study (the national average is one third). In addition to tertiary education, students are fully supported to go into vocational pathways.

As well as key educational qualifications we also have a focus on 'high performance', which includes Merit and Excellence endorsements and Scholarships. We are consistently getting double-digit Scholarships, with students achieving Top Scholar awards.

A Time for **Exploration**

AT WAKATIPU HIGH SCHOOL, WE BELIEVE THAT STUDENTS SHOULD HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO EXPERIENCE THE FULL BREADTH OF THE CURRICULUM IN THE JUNIOR YEARS BEFORE BECOMING MORE SPECIALISED IN THE SENIOR YEARS.



CURRICULUM

Students have the opportunity to experience the full breadth of the curriculum in the junior years. This incorporates future-focussed, personalised learning to drive engagement which becomes more specialised in the senior years.

Students in Year 9 and 10 experience the eight learning areas of the New Zealand Curriculum and get to choose subjects to allow them to explore their passions, while ensuring that they meet the literacy and numeracy thresholds required for academic success in the senior school.

We offer English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) class for second language learners, literacy and numeracy support, a Talent Development (Gifted and Talented) programme, separate Scholarship support, plus extension and accelerated learning opportunities across all the learning areas.


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
Choice is a key characteristic of the timetable. It is a key facilitator of engagement which supports learning, progress and achievement.

Year 9 and 10 students can choose twelve courses per year and senior students select up to six courses per year. The seamless timetable for juniors and seniors gives students the flexibility to study at a level that best suits them.

Students also have three dedicated periods per week where they meet with their Ako groups (formerly Tutor groups) and Kaiārahi (Learning Adviser) who supports students with their pastoral and academic needs and monitors students' well-being.







Method of **Reporting**

REGULAR FEEDBACK SUPPORTING STUDENT ENGAGEMENT, **LEARNING, PROGRESS AND ACHIEVEMENT.**

Learning Engagement Reports (LE Reports) are issued every three weeks to parents and students via email and through our online WHS Portal. The reports provide a clear overview, giving students the opportunity to modify learning behaviours, and giving parents the information they need to support learning and achievement.

Senior students and parents receive feedback each term as to how students are tracking towards their NCEA Qualification and the academic goals they set for themselves at the start of the year.

Kaiārahi provide mid-year and end-of-year comments summarising students' academic achievement, engagement indicators, extra and co-curricular involvement as well as an overall summary in relation to student citizenship.

Arts and **Culture**

WE OFFER AN EXTENSIVE ARTS PROGRAMME THROUGH OUR VISUAL ARTS, MUSIC AND DRAMA DEPARTMENTS, ALONG WITH EXCITING EXTRA-CURRICULAR OPPORTUNITIES. THE ARTS ARE OFFERED FROM YEAR 9 AND CAN BE STUDIED AT ALL NCEA LEVELS.

MUSIC

Music is an exciting part of our school curriculum and we have an award winning popular music band. Our jazz band regularly performs at venues around Queenstown and has won the South Island Championships.

Music is taught to both juniors and seniors plus individual tuition is available for many instruments such as guitar, keyboard and saxophone. We also have dedicated recording studios for our music and drama students to use.

DRAMA

Drama is available as a specialist option as well as being incorporated into our English programme with all our students seeing visiting cultural productions each year.

We also undertake a major musical and dramatic production each year and our international students are strongly encouraged to take part. Our new theatre accommodates 400 people and can be configured for a variety of different stage layouts.

VISUAL ARTS

Our Junior Art programmes are centred on developing skills understanding and appreciation for art works, artists and art making processes. This provides a strong foundation for completing art at a senior level.

Our Senior programme allows students to specialise in the fields of painting, photography and design and go on to study these at NCEA Level 2.

MAORI CULTURE

We have a Kapa Haka group to showcase our Maori programme and teach Maori as a language option.

DEBATING

Debating and public speaking are actively promoted through class, school and inter-school competitions.



Sports and the Snow

OUR SPORTS COORDINATOR AND ARTS COORDINATOR PROMOTE AND ENABLE STUDENT PARTICIPATION AND EXCELLENCE IN THEIR CHOSEN SPORT OR ACTIVITY.

As part of our great all-round education our goal is to have all students involved in extra and/or co-curricular activity. We offer a wide range of sport, cultural, leadership and arts opportunities to our students.

SPORTS

Many sports are available as extra-curricular activities. Local clubs offer coaching and team competition in sports that are not based at school. Queenstown has four excellent golf courses for golfing enthusiasts, tennis courts, a swimming pool and ice-skating rink in winter.

We have had multiple athletes succeed on the national and international stage in a variety of sports. Recently three students have attended the Winter Olympics and one has been selected for the Japanese Davis Cup Team.

YEAR 9 SNOW PROGRAMME

During Term 3, Year 9 students take part in a ski/snowboard programme that runs once a week for six weeks. This programme gives all students access to this very special aspect of our local environment and enables them to learn to ski/snowboard under the guidance of professional instructors as part of our Health and Physical Education programme.

NEW ZEALAND ALPINE SPORTS ACADEMY

Wakatipu High School has developed this unique programme as a successful high-level training option for elite athletes. Ski racing, cross-country skiing, snowboarding and tennis are among the Academy's sports.

This successful programme has been operating for 20 years and we have had members from New Zealand, Germany, France, Japan, Italy and England.





LIFE'S RICH OPPORTUNITIES



Camps and Recreation

SOME OF THE MOST MEMORABLE **SCHOOL DAYS AT WAKATIPU** HIGH SCHOOL ARE THOSE SPENT ON SCHOOL CAMPS AND IN THE **GREAT OUTDOORS.**

The school has developed a comprehensive and coordinated Junior Outdoor Education programme in our unique Queenstown environment. The Senior Outdoor Recreation courses build on the junior programme and mirror the special character of our school utilising the surrounding local area.

STUDENT CAMPS - YEAR 9 / 10

Our programme of backcountry school camps provide great opportunities for personal growth, learning skills in outdoor survival, caring for the environment, gaining new interests and developing responsible social interaction with others. International students often contribute in leadership roles for the junior camps.

SENIOR OUTDOOR RECREATION COURSE

Year 12 and 13 students gain credits and experiences in kayaking, tramping, bushcraft, mountain expeditions, snow caving and safety management. Highlights of the programme include tramping the Rockburn Valley, kayaking the Clutha River and a snow expedition at The Remarkables. A skills and aptitude assessment is needed prior to participation for qualification.

Student Support and Guidance

THE PASTORAL NETWORK **INVOLVES THE ENTIRE STAFF WORKING IN A SAFE, CARING ENVIRONMENT, ENSURING** STUDENTS REACH THEIR FULL POTENTIAL. THIS NETWORK HAS BUILT A SOLID FOUNDATION **BASED AROUND CARING FOR** INDIVIDUAL NEEDS - ACADEMIC. **SOCIAL OR EMOTIONAL.**

All students are assigned to a Kaiārahi (Guide or Mentor). The Kaiārahi supports and enables students' educational achievement and holistic development from the day they enter our learning community to the day they exit. Kaiārahi are the key point of contact for parents, students and staff when dealing with the pastoral life of students.

In partnership with parents, we ensure that each student has optimal opportunity to become an independent, caring, reliable and responsible member of the community.

HOUSES

The students are each assigned to one of five Houses - Arthur, Duncan, Fox, Hay and Mackenzie – each named after early settlers in the Wakatipu Basin.

Each House has a Dean who is responsible for the overall welfare of all students in their House. Each House is divided into a number of Ako groups with a Kaiārahi who meet three times per week. Students remain in the same Ako groups throughout their time at Wakatipu High School and as a result Kaiārahi get to know their students extremely well.

A strong and important aspect of the House system is the Inter-House competition. This is a fiercely-fought feature of the school calendar kicking off with Participation Day early in the year and includes a range of activities from the arts, sports and academia.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

There are numerous student leadership opportunities available, many of which are fostered through our Inter-House competition.

The Student Council and its sub-committees are responsible for developing our vibrant Inter-House competition which includes events such as Participation Day, Swim Sports, Haka/Waiata Competition, Debating, Waka-Maths and much more. There are multiple sub-committees of the Student Council, including Academic, Arts, Community and Service, Environmental, Sports and Whanaungatanga (Support) Councils.

House Leaders are responsible for organising students, developing House spirit and leading the charge in the Inter-House competition. We also run the Duke of Edinburgh programme for students from Year 10 and above.



InternationalStudent Support

Wakatipu High School has developed an excellent programme for international students. We currently have 47 students from 18 nationalities.

We have dedicated services for International students such as visa application, quality homestay placements and an approved study programme for English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL).

HOST FAMILIES

Wakaitpu High School has a network of experienced host families who enjoy providing long-term homestay accommodation for our international students. Queenstown has a long history of looking after our guests well and welcoming them into our community.

CAREER AND GUIDANCE COUNSELLING

International students are also offered career and guidance counselling to ensure that their subject selection and progress match their tertiary goals. Students are provided with pathways to study in New Zealand universities, overseas universities, and/or return to their home countries.

ESOL TEACHERS

We have two specialist teachers who provide classes at five different levels. They offer skills, pathways to NCEA and preparation for IELTS (International English Language Testing System).



THE SCHOOL PROVIDES WELL FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS. THEY RECEIVE APPROPRIATE SUPPORT AND PASTORAL CARE, ALONG WITH APPROPRIATE LEVELS OF SUPPORT WITH THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE. STUDENTS ARE INVOLVED IN A RANGE OF SCHOOL ACTIVITIES, INCLUDING EDUCATION OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM.

Homestay and Community

THE QUEENSTOWN COMMUNITY IS RENOWNED FOR WELCOMING **OVERSEAS VISITORS AND THIS** REPUTATION IS BUILT ON OUR **PASSION FOR HOSPITALITY** AND A DESIRE TO SHARE OUR **KNOWLEDGE OF THE AREA.**

All international students at Wakatipu High School are given the opportunity to join Queenstown families through the Homestay programme and many of these families have children already attending the school.

This close integration into the community gives students a real sense of belonging and provides a head start, allowing them to get to know the town and make friends quickly.

The Homestay programme is a well established and proven part of the Wakatipu High School culture with a dedicated Homestay Co-ordinator taking care of vetting, home visits and providing a liaison for everyone involved to help make the process straightforward and rewarding for everyone.





Pathways to the Future

WAKATIPU HIGH SCHOOL OFFERS STUDENTS THE NEW ZEALAND **NATIONAL CERTIFICATE OF EDUCATIONAL ACHIEVEMENT.**

NCEA is the main qualification for secondary students in New Zealand and it comes in three levels: Level 1, Level 2 and Level 3 which students usually work through from Year 11 to 13 (usually ages 15-18).

Students can also enter for the more academic Achievement Standards and/or Unit Standards which usually assess a more vocational based skill.

Students are assisted each week in their Ako (tutor/home room) time to choose the most appropriate subjects and plan pathways to achieve their goals. Their Ako teacher regularly checks that they are meeting these objectives.

Our Careers Teacher meets with senior students to discuss their goals and explain to them tertiary and job opportunities available for them. Some Year 12 and 13 students do work experience on a work visa to enable them to meet these goals. The Careers Teacher takes Year 13 students to selected New Zealand universities for Open Days to enable students to make informed choices.

The International Director checks with students, their agents and thus their parents that a student is working towards an agreed goal. Most students choose a tertiary course in New Zealand while others choose to work or study overseas. If a student chooses to return to their home country for further study or another overseas destination we can assist with this.


JUNE - VIETNAM (18 YEARS)
